1. Call to Order

Chairman Tyler called the TPO Board meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

2. Chairman's Announcements

Chairman Tyler had no announcements.

3. Confirmation of Quorum

Annette Crews, Polk TPO staff, confirmed a quorum of 13. No one representing the South County Block, and Commissioner Jeremy Clark representing the East County Block.

4. Opportunity for Public Comment

Chairman Tyler opened the floor to public comments. There were no public comments.

5. Agenda Review and Consent Agenda

Parag Agrawal, TPO Executive Director gave the agenda review for the June 9, 2022, TPO Board meeting which included consent items 5-8, Public Hearing on Draft FY 2022/23-2026/27 TIP, Review/Approve Draft TPO 2022 Priority Transportation Projects, State Road 544 Project Development and Environmental PD&E Study presentation and Southwest Connect I-4 Corridor Master Plan. PTA meeting will follow the Polk TPO Board meeting.

Other Action Items

10. Public Hearing on Draft FY 2022/23-2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program

Ryan Kordek, TPO Staff presented the Draft FY 2022/23-2026/27 Transportation Improvement Program. TPO Staff requested the TPO Board approve the Draft FY 2022/23-2026/27 TIP which included FDOT's Work Program Source of Most Projects. The plan outlined a \$1.3B Investment in Transportation and the new 5th year added. Public involvement included a 30-day comment period and a public hearing on June 9, 2022. 38 comments were in East Polk with a majority of comments related to US 27 and Interstate 4. The Chair opened the public hearing for public comment, there were none. Roll call vote required.

Motion: Motioned by Commissioner Braswell, seconded by Commissioner Santiago. Unanimous vote with present members.

11. Review/Approve Draft TPO 2022 Priority Transportation Projects

Mr. Kordek presented the Draft TPO 2022 Priority Transportation Projects which included candidate project phases for FY 2023/24-2027/28. 28 projects consisting of highway, intersection, transit, bicycle/pedestrian, and multi-use trail projects that total a cost of \$202M. The TPO's Adopted Momentum 2045 is the source for many of the priority projects and TPO's priorities are submitted to the FDOT for consideration in the development of the Draft Work Program that will be released in the fall. Mr. Kordek stated there continues to be a significant need and investment in resurfacing projects and noted the \$230M currently reflected in the TIP. Highway Priority Transportation Projects include I-4 @ SR 33 Interchange Reconstruction, US 98, US 92 and SR 33, US 17/92 in Haines City and Lake Alfred, SR

544, and Wabash Avenue Extension. US 92 (New Tampa Highway) has been a TPO priority project for more than 20 years. The project still needs ROW and CST funding. Complete Streets Priority Projects include US 17/92 in Lake Alfred, Roosevelt Drive in Winter Haven, US 92 Memorial Blvd. in Lakeland, and Johnson Ave Sidewalk project in Haines City. Multi-Use Trails include West Lake Hunter Trail in Lakeland, Ridge Scenic Highway Connector in Lake Wales, Old Dixie Trail Auburndale-Haines City, and Tenoroc Trail Lakeland-Auburndale. Candidate CIGP/TRIP Projects include Thompson Nursery Road Widening/Re-alignment. TAC recommended the TPO Board approve the Draft 2022 Priority Transportation Projects. Commissioner Santiago ask Ryan to be a little more detailed about the 17/92 project in the Haines City area since that is the area that seems to have the most comments and concerns. Ryan stated that we have two projects there overlapping. The two to four lanes widening of 17/92 in downtown Haines City from Scenic Highway or 10th Street to 17th Street where 92 takes a 90 degree turn and heads up towards Davenport. This has been the longest standing project over the last 10 years. The other concern is 17/92 from US 27 to CR 54. The PD&E Study was funded by FDOT but fell out of the Work Program a couple years ago, but staff will be encouraging FDOT to place that project back in the Work Program. Commissioner Santiago agrees that the 17/92 to CR 54 needs to be added back to the Work Program. L.K. Nandam commented that the decision was made to remove that project for a couple of reasons. The re-surfacing program ballooned, so FDOT had to figure out how to balance revenues while accommodating resurfacing needs. The second dynamic was to wait and see what happened with the Central Polk Parkway Segment going around east of 27. The previous PD&E Study for Central Polk Parkway going from 60, paralleling 27 and all the way to 54 needs to be re-evaluated. The Turnpike is looking at doing that evaluation, but 54 going to Poinciana Parkway is going to connect to 429 and that area is going to be a new alignment area. The outcome of this project will depend on the need for the 17/92 project. Commissioner Clark echoed Commissioner Santiago and wanted it on record that the 17/92 project does need to be added back to the Priority List. Commissioner Daley asked about 557 (Priority #20) and how they will proceed if the 17/92 project is not added back to the Work Program. City of Lake Alfred supports the project being moved back into the Work Program as soon as possible. Commissioner Yates commented about the Thompson Nursey Road widening project and does support that work to be done. Winter Haven has many lakes and Nursey Thompson Road would be a very important project in the Work Program.

Motion: Motioned by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Lindsey. Motion carried without dissent.

Presentations and Status Reports

12. State Road 544 (Lucerne Park Road) Project Development and Environmental Study (PD&E) Study

Abra Horne, Environmental Administrator for District One. The SR 544 PD&E Study will be conducted from Martin Luther King Boulevard to SR 17. The purpose of the study is to evaluate engineering and environmental data. To document project impacts, costs, and determine the type, preliminary design, and location of the proposed improvements. The project length is 8 miles with three jurisdictions immediately butting the corridor and they are City of Winter Haven, Polk County, and Haines City. The need for the project is to accommodate the projected increase in traffic demand, enhance safety for motorists, pedestrians, bicyclist, emergency evacuation and improve connectivity. The existing conditions are twolane urban minor arterial, two twelve-foot travel lanes, paved shoulders, open/closed drainage systems, curb and gutter at various locations, speed limit ranges from 35 to 55 MPH and existing right-of-way width varies. Environmental effects that arose in the alternatives meeting that was held February 8, 2022, was wetlands, floodplains, threatened and endangered species, water quality, hazardous materials, recreational sites, noise, air quality, historic structures, and archaeological sites. The Hybrid Public Meeting had 104 in-person attendees and 22 virtual attendees. There were 64 comments received. Commissioner Combee ask if roundabouts save money and how many roundabouts are currently in Polk County. Ms. Horne also commented that roundabouts prevent the domino effect when accidents occur. The lower the speed, the closer people can be which more cars can flow. Mayor Pro Tem Birdsong ask when the PD&E study will be complete, and Ms. Horne stated 2023. L.K. Nandam commented that the projects that were moved out of the Work Program are going to be evaluated and possibly moved back. Commissioner Read commented about the roundabout being constructed on Drain Field Road and how the improvements are being implemented to the community. Commissioner Yates addressed a question about Phase 1. Commissioner Daley commented that roundabouts do prevent t- bone crashes. Commissioner Daley and the City of Lake Alfred is requesting that the cutting through Lake Alfred solution for SR 544 be taken off the table and let the cut through be in Winter Haven. Commissioner Tyler commented that we must get a handle on the behavior of drivers before we can construct roundabouts and educate the public on their proper use. Mayor Mutz commented that when you use roundabouts you should look left and go right, you don't have to worry about someone hitting you from the right, only the left. Commissioner Combee commented about the Vision Zero Workshop that FDOT hosted recently and how

informative it was regarding roundabouts. Commissioner Combee would like to see that workshop offered again for others who did not get to attend.

13. Southwest Connect I-4 Corridor Master Plan

Secretary Nandam congratulated Josh Jester for passing his professional engineer test and becoming a new engineer. Josh Jester, FDOT presented the I-4 Corridor Master Plan. District 7 has a program called Tampa Bay Next which is Tampa Bay's Interstate Program where they are looking at doing improvements for I-275, I-75 and I-4. Their program has improvement along I-4 coming all the way to the Polk Parkway (west). Then on the opposite side of Polk County in the Orlando area, there is the I-4 Beyond the Ultimate Project, which is currently finishing up construction and is open to traffic. Both projects are looking at adding express lanes to the Interstate. The I-4 Master Plan in Polk County is looking at connecting these two projects together from the Polk Parkway to the US 27 Interchange. The purpose of the project is to address the existing operational deficiencies of I-4 within Polk County and to accommodate future travel demand because of forecasted population and employment growth and to preserve the operational integrity and regional functionality of I-4 and enhance emergency evacuation and response times. A public outreach meeting was held September 27, 2021, through October 8, 2021, which was virtual. In-person open house was held September 27, 2021, at the Lake Crago Recreational Center in Lakeland. Phase 1 feasibility will develop existing and future traffic volumes, analyze existing and future no build, and build levels-of-service, explore I-4 widening alternatives included general purpose and managed lanes, and develop a year of need for the I-4 corridor segments. The next step is phase 2 which will establish future I-4 mainline improvements and integrate with the Tampa Bay Next and I-4 BTU projects. D5 and D7 will be coordinating with D1 regarding the next phase. A safety slide was presented regarding your vehicle and technology. Mayor Pro-Tem Birdsong asked if the improvements under construction at CR 557 are going to take into consideration what D7 and D5 are doing with their long-range planning for the corridor? Mr. Jester commented that "FDOT had a very old document that identified a 10-lane typical section for I-4, so all the bridges that have been constructed since 1998 when the document was produced have been taken into consideration that 10-lane typical". So, CR 557 is being set up so that regardless of if we come through with managed lanes or additional general use lanes, that intersection will not have to be re-configured. Mayor Pro-Tem Birdsong asked if the median will be taken away that has been talked about for the high-speed rail. Mr. Jester said no that they fully intend to preserve that area for future transit services.

Communications and Reports

14. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Agrawal gave the Executive Director's Report. He announced the Joint Meeting of the Sun Coast Transportation Planning Alliance (SCTPA), and the Central Florida MPO Alliance (CFMPOA) will be held on June 10th in Haines City. The agendas were handed out to the Board Members. The meeting will be held from 9:30am to 11:00am. Investing in Mobility will be the topic discussed. The afternoon meeting will host a panel who will discuss Sun Runner and a Transportation Surtax. A workshop will be held at FDOT, and the topic will be Integrating Land Use with Transportation on June 28, 2022. Polk TPO is currently working with Polk cities for letters of support to apply for federal grant funding. Polk TPO is working with Polk IT for a GIS data viewer for the Polk County residents, and it will be launched at the next TPO Board Meeting.

15. Florida Department of Transportation Report

Secretary Nandam discussed the outcome of the Vision Zero Workshop that was hosted by FDOT. The purpose of the workshop is for the local communities to take back what was offered and should each community adopt Vision Zero. Governor DeSantis did sign the budget and granted the Federal Relief Funding and the US 98 widening going north from Socrum Loop all the way to County North 54, as well as the US 98 Peace River Bridge in Fort Meade. Both projects will be added to the Work Program. Edith Perez, FDOT discussed the Lakeland Road Diet Project will have a public workshop on July 11, 2022. June 1st the meeting was advertised, and they are hoping for a good turnout. A Speed Management Workshop is being planned for this September and the targeted audience is elected officials. Mobility Week is Oct 21 thru Oct 28, 2022.

16. Opportunity for Public Comment

Floor opened for public comments and there were none.

17. Board Member Comments

Floor opened for Board Member comments. Commissioner Lindsey presented a handout to the Board members for review. The hand-out was regarding a one-cent sales tax and the plan now has more credibility details to follow. This was an informational item for your review to start having a conversation about this idea. The money would be used for transportation issues. He referred to a chart

provided by the budget staff over the 12-year period gives the percentage of funds each city would be granted. Most of the money would come to Polk County as they are biggest jurisdiction. As proposed, the tax would not be collected until Jan 1, 2025, and the last of the funded projects should be completed around 2047. Commissioner Lindsey was not asking for action, but for each city to take this to your commissions and start having the conversations about this topic. Commissioner Daley ask about the transportation priority projects and the comments that were made during the meeting and what happens to them after the meeting is adjourned.

18. Adjournment

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:47 a.m.

Summary: The County is seeking an endorsement, by way of a TPO resolution,

for a Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Action Plan Grant application. Polk County is the lead applicant for SS4A Action Plan grant. A consortium of the County, the Polk TPO, Lakeland, and other cities have been developing the grant application on behalf of all communities county-

wide and will become Joint Applicants.

If awarded, the grant will be used to greatly expand the Vision Zero (Action) plan that is currently underway using TPO funding. It will also identify and forward safety projects and strategies making us highly competitive for SS4A project grants in subsequent years.

The SS4A grant was established by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law as a discretionary grant program. This program will provide \$5-6 billion in grants over the next 5 years. The funding supports a goal of zero deaths and serious injuries on our roadways.

The Federal Notice of Funding Opportunity strongly encourages that all eligible grantees make a combined application. The grant deadline is September 15th, 2022. The SS4A Grant request is estimated to be up to \$1 million. The SS4A Grant requires a 20 percent local, non-federally derived, cash match. The consortium is preparing to propose an additional 10 percent in-kind match.

POLK TPO RESOLUTION 2022-08

RESOLUTION OF THE POLK TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION (TPO) SUPPORTING EFFORTS TO SECURE AWARD OF A SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL GRANT (SS4A)

WHEREAS, over the last 10 years all Polk County Stakeholders and Partners have taken several planning, outreach/education, and implementation actions in support of safety initiatives; and,

WHEREAS, the planning actions have included the adoption of a Complete Streets Policy in 2012, action plans for eight (8) of the most unsafe corridors in the County in 2015, Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Action Plans in 2015 and 2020, and the evaluation of sidewalk needs near public schools in 2017; and,

WHEREAS, the outreach/education actions have included a Pledge to Slow Down campaign to bring awareness to the dangers of speeding and, as part of this campaign, developed several short safety videos demonstrating the effects of speeding and kicked-off the Pedestrian Bicycle Student Education Program to supplement and greater facilitate the curricula for grades K-8; and,

WHEREAS, the implementation has included the pursuit and award of Safe Routes to School grants which resulted in the installation of sidewalk in areas of critical need near schools and, in partnership with Polk Vision, the formation of a bicycle/pedestrian team and accompanying tactical plans to support pedestrian and cyclist safety; and,

WHEREAS, in the past five years, ending in 2020, an average of 126 lives were cut short and 462 people were severely incapacitated while traveling on Polk roadways; and,

WHEREAS, the 2016-2020 annual average roadway deaths increased by 27 percent over that of the 2011-2015, while the population grew by 12.6 percent and now Polk County is currently the fastest growing county in Florida and the seventh fastest growing county in the nation; and,

WHEREAS, for multiple years running, until the methodology changed in 2021, the Lakeland/Winter Haven Lakeland metro area was identified by Smart Growth America as the among the 10 most dangerous places in the nation to walk - now 21st in 2021; and,

WHEREAS, in addition to the emotional trauma, the families forever altered, and the community disruption; these severe crash outcomes on Polk County

roadways cost the economy an average of over \$1.75 billion a year in direct and indirect costs, according to the Florida Department of Transportation; and,

WHEREAS, the Polk Communities and Partners, finding deaths and severe injuries on our roadways clearly unacceptable, has adopted a target of zero fatalities and incapacitating injuries; and,

WHEREAS, the Polk communities and Partners are coming together around Vision Zero and the Polk TPO has begun developing an initial Vision Zero Plan with the funding currently available to it; and,

WHEREAS, the initial Vision Zero Plan will provide a consolidated crash database, identify important county-wide conditions and trends, identify roadway fatal and incapacitating injury hot spots, and develop an initial set of 'low-hanging fruit' projects within a 10-year planning horizon; and,

WHEREAS, the initial Vision Zero Plan does continue to move the TPO forward in addressing the goal of Zero; it does not provide all the elements required to apply for Safe Streets and Roads for All Implementation [e.g., capital project] grants in future years; and,

WHEREAS, although a modicum of additional funding would result in a Vision Zero Plan that meets the minimum required elements to apply for Safe Streets and Roads for All Implementation grants; it would not likely result in winning Safe Streets and Roads for All Implementation grant projects; and,

WHEREAS, Polk County desires to be awarded a portion of the \$5 Billion in Safe Streets and Roads for All funding allocated for winning implementation projects to achieve zero fatalities, it will pursue Safe Streets and Roads for All Action Plan funding in the 2022-2023 year to develop a robust Vision Zero plan and on-going program with highly competitive safety projects that can be completed within the five-year SS4A performance period; and,

WHEREAS, to provide the missing required Vision Zero elements necessary to apply for an SS4A Implementation Grant and produce a robust Vision Zero Plan with highly competitive, quickly implementable projects; the 2022-2023 Action Plan funding will be used to, among other tasks:

1. investigate severe crash and pedestrian/cyclist involved hot spots identified by the initial Vision Zero Plan in a more granular way to better determine causes for Polk TPO Resolution 2022-08 August 25, 2022 Page 2

the severe crashes and pedestrian/cyclist involved crashes;

- 2. set up for the implementation of proven strategies to eliminate existing severe crash hot spots and prevent the creation of future crash hot spots in a cost-effective and lasting way;
- 3. fully engage and incorporate the feedback of the local communities and, where reasonable, the travelers within the existing and likely future crash hotspots;
- 4. assess the impacts of the recommended strategies for disadvantaged populations as required in the SS4A Implementation grant submittal and, if desirable, the environmental impacts as required to implement the strategies;
- 5. provide needed technical and material assistance in building upon and completing the existing Polk Vision Pedestrian and Bike Team Tactical Plan which will pilot projects in partnering communities and complete a web-based book of Polk safety practices; and,
- 6. build upon and further the process of eliminating the previously identified school area sidewalk gaps and further the process of preparing the already identified unsafe corridors for safety improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Polk TPO hereby supports efforts to secure award of a Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant.

POLK COUNTY IS UNIQUE

Polk County is a community of 17 municipalities strategically located between the Orlando and Tampa Bay areas of Central Florida. As such, it is a critical transportation and economic hub and home to 753,000 people. Between 2010 and 2020, Polk had the fastest population growth in Florida and the seventh highest in the nation. With historical roots in agriculture and mining and as a growing logistical hub, Polk is a diverse community. Nearly half (46%) of Polk's census tracts are disadvantaged as per the Federal Justice 40 Initiative. In comparison, just over one-third (35%) of Florida's census tracts are disadvantaged.

In 2021, the Lakeland-Winter Haven area was listed as the 9th most dangerous metro area in the U.S. to be a pedestrian.

When last assessed in 2018, Polk had an overall roadway fatality rate per capita substantially worse than that of Florida as a whole and worse than all but five states. In 2021, the Lakeland-Winter Haven area was listed as the 9th most dangerous metro area in the U.S. to be a pedestrian. The five-year annual average of lives lost and people suffering severe injuries on Polk roadways ending in 2020 was 126 and 462, respectively. These fatalities and incapacitating injuries cost the economy an average of \$1.75 billion each year.

POLK COUNTY HAS EXPERIENCE

Polk County and the Polk Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) is the leader in roadway safety planning. Its first breakthrough was a Complete Streets Policy in 2012.

Additional current safety initiatives include:

- Action plans for 8 of the most unsafe corridors (2016)
- Safety action plans for pedestrians and cyclists (2020 -Updated)
- Sidewalk gaps evaluation near schools (2017-2019)
- 12 regional awards for safety (2001-2016)
- National awards for two different roadway public service announcement safety campaigns: Pledge to Slow Down (2018) and Every Life Counts (2016)
- Gulf Coast Safe Streets Summit (2022)
- Formation of a Vision Zero Task Force (2022)

The communities within Polk are following suit by having important conversations and making decisions regarding the safety of their residents. Lakeland, the largest community, is a Vision Zero Goal city and bronze-level Bicycle-Friendly and Walk-Friendly Community.

Why apply for a Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Grant?

The new Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program provides \$5 billion in grants over the next 5 years. These grants are part of the Federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill approved by Congress in 2021.

Polk's community SS4A Grant application is for completing the county-wide Vision Zero Action Plan that will enhance the past and ongoing Vision Zero efforts.

The FFY 2022-2023 Polk community SS4A application is for completing the Vision Zero Action Plan and will build upon the ongoing Vision Zero study. Having a pre-qualifying and highly rated Action Plan is a crucial prerequisite to future applications for SS4A Implementation funding. The FY 2022-2023 Action Plan funds will result in a federally qualifying, highly rated, holistic and well-defined plan to reach Zero countywide.

The countywide strategy and action plan, envisioned for our robust Action [Vision Zero] Plan, will include:

- **leadership commitments** with a time target for Zero and the setting of interim goals;
- **planning structure** to develop, implement, and monitor the Plan;
- mapped risk areas including crash hot spots, high risk road features and specific user safety needs:
- safety analyses for risk areas that incorporate engagement, collaboration, and equity considerations;
- policy and procedure assessments addressing systemic changes to improve safety countywide;
- action plans for implementation of projects and strategies with prioritized timelines;
- documented reviews of safety, efficacy, equity, cost, climate, and economic effects, with further outreach as necessary, for each project recommended for SS4A Implementation funds;
- progress reporting and transparency methods, protocols and timelines; and,
- low-cost, high-impact strategies that can improve safety over a wider geographical area.

The county-wide action plan will identify at least 10 of the most dangerous corridors and intersections in the county and will develop conceptual level design and project estimates.

Polk communities will include these designs and estimates in their CIPs and will apply for future SS4A implementation Grants.

What is the Schedule?

The grant application for FFY 2022-2023, with accompanying resolutions and letters of support, is due **September 15, 2022**. Although the performance period for the Action Plan is not to exceed two years, we will complete the work within 18 months after receipt of funding to permit us to apply for the 2024-2025 SS4A Implementation Funding.

Wildlife crossing in Polk County will be 1st for I-4 between Tampa, Orlando

The Hilochee Wildlife Management Area symbolizes Florida.

The state-owned property encompassing nearly 16,000 acres abounds with wildness. Its Osprey Unit, covering 6,153 acres in Polk County, contains a mix of pine flatwoods and wetlands, providing home territory for animals ranging from white-tailed deer, bobcats and the occasional Florida panther to alligators, otters and skunks.

And yet, like so much of Florida's green space, Hilochee Wildlife Management Area is fragmented. Interstate 4 bisects the Osprey Unit, slicing across it in two sections.

Brent Setchell of the Florida Department of Transportation stood in Hilochee on a recent afternoon, about 100 yards south of I-4, as the unceasing traffic created background noise.

"The deer on this side of the road haven't seen the deer on that side of the road in 50 years," Setchell said, underestimating the interval since this stretch of I-4 was completed in the 1960s.

Interstate 4 will only widen in coming years, presenting an even more daunting impediment for deer and other wildlife migrating through Central Florida. But the animals will soon have a way to get from one side to the other without risking the almost certain death of crossing six lanes of traffic.

The Department of Transportation is overseeing construction of a wildlife underpass, the first designated animal crossing on I-4 between Orlando and Tampa. The underpass, part of

a \$71 million project to reconstruct the County Road 557 interchange, is being built about three-quarters of a mile east of the bridge.

"Obviously, I-4 is a barrier to wildlife," Setchell said as he led a media tour of the construction site. "So, there's over 100,000 vehicles per day that travel on I-4. And so having this, it's a barrier to wildlife movement. They cannot cross."

Setchell is a District Drainage Design Engineer for District 1, based in Bartow and overseeing 12 counties as far south as Collier County. He said the underpass will create "permeability" that reconnects currently isolated sections of Hilochee Wildlife Management Area.

"And so, you've got good conservation lands on both sides that are protected in perpetuity," he said. "And so, this is a great opportunity to reestablish the natural corridors for wildlife, to be able to reconnect to the areas that hadn't been connected in (more than) 50 years since the interstate was built."

The project acknowledges the concept of the Florida Wildlife Corridor, which is also the name of a nonprofit organization dedicated to preserving the contiguous stretches of undeveloped land that large mammals, particularly black bears and Florida panthers, need to maintain healthy populations.

A contingent of conservationists began promoting the concept more than a decade ago through the first of several expeditions covering much of the state. Those treks, described in photo and video documentaries, emphasized how fragmented Florida's remaining natural areas are.

During the first journey, a crew of four drew attention to I-4 as a particular impediment for migrating wildlife.

Jason Lauritsen, chief conservation officer for the Florida Wildlife Corridor Foundation, said that natural areas suitable for animal migration encompass 18 million acres that is generally connected — except for the barriers of roads.

"We have a pretty substantial network of roads and highways, interstates, throughout the state of Florida," Lauritsen said. "And each one of those, in some form or fashion, when it crosses the corridor has a fragmenting effect. And if we purchase all the land, but we fail to maintain or improve permeability in the roads, we'll still have a fragmented, broken corridor that doesn't function. So having permeable infrastructure, having permeable roads, permeable to wildlife – that's critical."

The concept of conserving and protecting land throughout the Florida Wildlife Corridor has gained mainstream political acceptance in recent years. The Florida Legislature last year passed the Florida Wildlife Corridor Act, which provided \$300 million specifically to protect the corridor.

Planned for decades

Setchell said that FDOT has long contemplated building the first designated wildlife crossing on this stretch of I-4.

In a 1998 study, the Federal Highway Administration recommended three wildlife crossings along the interstate in Polk County. In the years since, FDOT has coordinated with federal and state agencies to determine the best locations for the crossings.

The Department of Transportation had plans to create a crossing a few miles to the east, but the CR 557 interchange project gave the agency the chance to build an underpass several years sooner by shifting the location, Setchell said. Incorporating the crossing into the CR 557 project meant extending the construction zone to the east and added about \$8 million to the cost, he said.

The contracting team of Skanska and DRMP is building three new travel lanes in each direction on the outside of the current lanes. When work is completed, the inside lanes will be removed, creating an open area that will allow later widening and the construction of a rail line.

FDOT expects to shift traffic onto the new lanes by the end of this year.

The underpass will be 61 feet wide, with a vertical clearance of about 8 feet — plenty large enough for even bears and panthers. The design includes a swale at the eastern edge that will

be wet at least part of the year, inviting alligators, snakes and frogs to cross under the highway, Setchell said.

When completed, the crossing will cover 423 feet from one side of I-4 to the other.

The design calls for 10-foot-high, chain-link fences topped with barbed wire that will extend at least a quarter-mile on each side of the crossing entrance along I-4. Setchell said that barrier is intended to funnel animals toward the gaps leading to the underpass.

As a further funneling element, the bottom 28 inches of the fences will contain a tighter grid pattern intended to prevent even smaller animals, such as snakes and frogs, from getting through and entering the highway.

Will they cross the road?

Will animals actually use the underpass?

"Absolutely," Setchell said. "We have great documentation of wildlife utilizing our existing crossings all throughout the state, but especially in District 1 in Southwest Florida."

Indeed, wildlife crossings are not a new concept. The Department of Transportation began to incorporate underpasses in construction plans as early as the 1970s, focusing first on the extension of Interstate 75 from Naples to Fort Lauderdale through the main habitat of the endangered Florida panther.

Through new construction and retrofitting, the agency has created 60 wildlife underpasses and bridges for panthers in South Florida.

FDOT already maintains two bear crossings under I-4 in Volusia County and along State Road 46 in Lake and Seminole counties, areas that contain some of the state's largest concentrations of black bears.

A database managed by FDOT shows about 250 crossings on state-maintained roads, a list that includes bridges and culverts.

While this is the first crossing under I-4 in Polk County designed for wildlife, Setchell noted that a historic cattle road under the highway exists about three miles to the east. It lacks the funnel fencing and other design elements being used for the CR 557 crossing.

Hilochee Wildlife Management Area, overseen by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, is largely pine flatwoods in the Osprey Unit on the south side of I-4. The tract also contains wet areas, and a cypress dome stands just east of the crossing site, giving way to a shallow marsh nurturing such aquatic plants as buttonbush and pickerelweed.

A nonprofit conservation group, fStop Foundation, mounted cameras on trees near the construction site on both sides of I-4 about a year ago. The motion-activated cameras have captured video and still images of animals in the area, including deer, bobcats, raccoons, coyotes, opossums, wild turkeys and even softshell turtles.

During the recent tour, Setchell and media members stood under the platform of the new eastbound lanes, on what will be the dirt floor of the wildlife crossing. Noting that the highway structure creates a shady zone, Setchell said cameras at other crossings have captured animals taking naps in them.

The continuous whoosh of traffic on I-4 seems a potential deterrent to wildlife, but Setchell said animals become habituated to it and parents teach their offspring to overcome the natural fear of the noise. He described videos showing adult Florida panthers making a squeaking sound to coax balky youngsters forward into a crossing.

William Freund, fStop Foundation's president, said the cameras have not yet recorded any bears or panthers, but Florida's widest-ranging mammals do sometimes traverse Polk County.

Just last month, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission reported finding the remains of a Florida panther along the Polk Parkway just south of U.S. 92 in Auburndale. The agency has recorded four other panther deaths in the county over the past decade and several sightings of live panthers.

Most of the estimated 120 to 230 Florida panthers live in Southwest Florida.

Lauritsen, of the Florida Wildlife Corridor, said wildlife corridors fit into three general categories: commuter routes, used regularly as the animal traverses its home range; migration (or season) routes, which an animal might use once or twice a year with few stops between points; and dispersal corridors, explored perhaps only once in an animal's life, such as when leaving its natal habitat to establish its own range.

"And that animal is the animal, really, that this corridor I think represents the most value to, is that dispersing individual animal, which is going to travel a long, long distance and cross I-4," Lauritsen said. "So this would be a really good example of a dispersal corridor. And you may get some seasonal movements back and forth there as well."

Bear illustrates barrier

The famous sauntering of a black bear known as M-34 helped inspire the Florida Wildlife Corridor project, and that bear's journey illustrated the impediment that I-4 poses for even the largest mammals.

Biologists captured the male bear near Sebring in 1989, when he was 2½ years old, and fitted him with a GPS tracking collar. In subsequent years, biologists tracked M34 as he crossed the Kissimmee River and trekked northwest through Polk County.

The bear reached the Celebration area in Osceola County and then spent a week traveling along the south edge of I-4, approaching the highway as if he wanted to cross, according to a biologist's account summarized on the Florida Wildlife Corridor website.

Finally, at a point near Polk City — about two miles west of where the crossing is now being constructed — M34 abandoned his attempt at northward progress and turned back to the south, eventually traveling to Lake Okeechobee and lingering in Glades and Charlotte counties before his tracking collar reached maximum recording capacity.

During an eight-week excursion, the bear had covered more than 500 miles and ranged over about 100 miles from north to south.

Had the crossing been in place at the time, M34 might have wandered farther north.

As a supplement to the new I-4 crossing, FDOT has installed a "box culvert" along CR 557 at the western edge of the Hilochee WMA's Osprey Unit. At 5 feet square, the opening under the two-lane road will provide another means of safe passage for animals as large as bears. Setchell said the culvert aligns with an easement for power lines running parallel to I-4 that has become a migration route for wildlife.

The Department of Transportation has long-term plans to build two other crossings in Polk County. One is a wildlife bridge to be built just west of the Polk Parkway overpass, about

eight miles west of the crossing now under construction. Setchell said the wildlife overpass will be built beside the Conn's HomePlus store on the north side of I-4.

The agency also seeks to create an animal crossing as part of the long-delayed redesign of the SR 33 interchange, about 3 miles west of the Polk Parkway. FDOT hasn't received funding for either of those projects, but Setchell said agency leaders hope the federal budget process for the coming fiscal year — due to be released July 1 — will include the needed money.

Wildlife corridors are important not only because they allow large predators to roam more widely with reduced competition for prey. When animals meet and mate with a wider range of their species over a larger range of habitat, the species is healthier, Lauritsen said.

"You've populations that have existed for generations, north of I-4, and populations that have existed for generations, south of I-4, that have never exchanged genes," Lauritsen said. "They're sort of genetically isolated."

Setchell picked up on that idea.

"Being able to get this connection and being able to re-establish that genetic diversity, is going to be great," he said. "I think it's very important to have this corridor here and this crossing to be able to do that."
